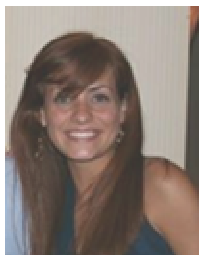
Last Week's Meeting

Group Study Exchange

Melanie Chandler Giovino has been selected as part of the team to travel to India with the Rotary District 6920 Group Study Exchange Program. The 27 year old graduated from Evans High School and continued her education



at Augusta State University. She graduated from ASU with a BA in Biology, December 2006 and plans on getting her Master's Degree in Biology as well. She is currently employed by the Department of Natural Resources as an Environmental Specialist.

Rotary International, About the program

The Rotary Foundation's Group Study Exchange (GSE) program is a unique cultural and vocational exchange opportunity for businesspeople and professionals between the ages of 25 and 40 who are in the early stages of their careers. The program provides travel grants for teams to exchange visits in paired areas of different countries. For four to six weeks, team members experience the

host country's culture and institutions, observe how their vocations are practiced abroad, develop personal and professional relationships, and exchange ideas. In a typical four-week tour, applicants participate in five full days of vocational visits, 15 to 20 club presentations, 10 to 15 formal visits and social events, two to three days at the district conference, three to four hours per day of cultural and site tours, and three to four hours per day of free time with host families. For each team member, the Foundation provides the most economical round-trip airline ticket between the home and host countries. Rotarians in the host area provide for meals, lodging, and group travel within their district.
